


Going to miss your worms over the holidays? Here are some crafts you can do. Then you can teach your friends and family all about worms and what they do not just during the holidays but all year long too.




Fridge Magnet

Get some pom poms and glue them to a close pin as shown above. You can use all the same size of pom poms or if you can use one that is bigger than the rest as a head. Googly eyes, or pieces of paper, can then be added to the face to create eyes. For the antenna take pipe cleaner, cut them to length of your choice and glue them to the back of the head. Lastly glue one or two magnets to the back of the close pin.

Bookworm bookmarks

Cut the corner off of a paper envelope. Make sure not to cut to far up because your bookmark will have a hard time staying on your page. Cut a worm out of whatever colour paper you want your worm to be. Draw a face on your worm using a black felt pen. Glue your worm to the corner of the envelope. Decorate and or colour how you want.
