Water make up 70% of the human body. Each day we must replace 2.4L of water some through drinking water & the rest through food.

Ninety-seven percent of the earth's water is saltwater in oceans and seas. Of the 3% that is freshwater, only 1% is available for drinking—the remaining 2% is frozen in the polar ice caps.

It is estimated that 34,000 people die each day worldwide due to diseases related to water.
