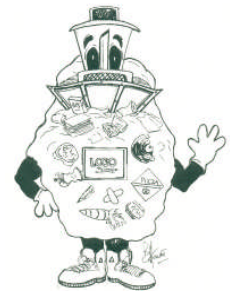
### Are you Wasting Your Waste?
