

## City of Prince George hosts Canada Day in the Lheidli T'enneh Memorial Park

The City of Prince George is gearing up for another exciting Canada Day celebration at Lheidli T'enneh Memorial Park on July 1 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Opening ceremonies at the bandshell start at noon with an opening from Lheidli T'enneh First Nation Elder Edith Frederick and a cake cutting to recognize Canada's 157th anniversary at 12:30 p.m. The marketplace, food pavilion, and kids zone open at 11 a.m. Despite recent rainfall, the City is not hosting fireworks this year due to the current BC Wildfire burning restrictions.
